# Increasing jump lists


n a previous article, *Fixing jump lists* (see March newsletter), I mentioned how I am a big fan of jump lists. For those unfamiliar with jump lists, they provide very quick access to recent documents by right-clicking on a program icon in the Start menu or on the taskbar. The program must be designed to support jump lists, so if you right-click a program icon and it does not show any of your recent documents, complain to the vendor!

One frustration I have is that jump lists are limited to a maximum of 10 items. I don't know about you, but I work on more than 10 documents per program and I want quick access to *all* of them. Okay, maybe not all, but certainly more than 10.

In Windows 10, Microsoft has taken away Windows 7's easy Control Panel means of increasing the number of items that can be on jump lists. What possible reason could there be to remove this functionality?!?! Fortunately, you can make a registry change to accomplish this.

First, make sure you have jump lists enabled. In *Settings* | *Personalization* | *Start*, make sure *Show recently opened items in Jump Lists...* is turned on.


Click the Start button. Type in **regedit** and hit enter. In the left panel, drill down to the location shown in the red box in the screenshot here. Right-click on *Advanced* and choose *New*, *DWORD* (32-bit) Value



New Value #1 will appear in the right panel, highlighted so you can rename it simply by typing. Type in the new name JumpListItems\_Maximum and press Enter. If you accidentally hit some other key, leaving it as New Value #1, right-click it and choose Rename.

Double-click *JumpListItems\_Maximum*, click on *Decimal* in the *Base* section, and change the *Value data*: to the number of items you want jump lists to hold. The

number you choose may be dictated by the resolution of your screen or the text scaling value you use. I have a pretty high-resolution screen, so I went with 30.



Click the OK button and quit the registry editor. The change takes effect immediately.

While I am ranting about the things Microsoft takes away from us, let me add another from my long list; the ability to reorder items on jump lists. In Windows 7, you could just drag and drop jump list items to order them any

PowerPoint "Slide Master" Part 2 (What can we do with this power?) By Lawrence Patterson lawrence@opcug.ca

Now that we've opened your eyes to the existence of PowerPoint's "Slide Master" function and that it has a significant purpose in having your presentation "wow" your audience (remember KISS), let's review the functionality available with next month's presentation dealing with the *How*.

Below is a top 7 overview from Maurizo La Cava's "SLIDE MASTER POWERPOINT: THE COMPLETE GUIDE TO MAKE THE BEST USE OF IT" (https://mauriziolacava.com/lean-presentation-design-blog/presentation-design-technique/slide-master-powerpoint/). I found it to be the right amount of detail / advice on how to best utilize the "Slide Master".

- Using the "Slide Master" can save hours of work in the setup / application of your presentation's layout (Maurizo also notes, that, misunderstood, it can easily increase frustration);
- Assigning a background across all or specific slides will allow you to select foreground elements with ease;
- Using placeholders (Text, Picture, Table, etc.) sets the consistency for a perfect presentation;
- Selecting the right Colour Combination to your themes ahead of time minimizes adjustments after the fact;
- Assigning the appropriate Font combination to your Theme(s) will keep the presentation readable;
- Setting up Editable Placeholders allows you to concentrate on content versus trying to adjust your spacing;
- Applying Colour, Font and Editable Placeholders into Themes can be applied to the entire presentation or grouped amongst various slides.


## Creating a Simple Video Tutorial by Alan German

have a friend who, each time she returns from a trip, has difficulty downloading the digital photographs from her camera to her PC. In the past, we have tried sitting down at the computer and slowly going through the process, and have also used TeamViewer to repeat this exercise remotely. Unfortunately, this one-off approach didn't seem to stick. I then tried writing out a series of step-by-step instructions but, apparently, my friend got lost around Step 3! Clearly, another technique was required.

And then I thought of YouTube University. That's my usual go-to source for how-to information. Now, there may well be appropriate video tutorials on YouTube that would solve the file transfer between devices issue, but I thought that making a custom video couldn't be too difficult.

In fact, this idea gave me the opportunity to try a category of software – desktop video capture - that had interested me for some time but for which I previously had no real application.

Looking for some free software that would let me experiment led me to Debut Screen Recorder Software, a free version of the package made available for non-commercial use by its developer, NCH Software.



Running the program is initially a little disconcerting since it runs on the desktop and displays the desktop with itself running on the desktop! However, the program's basic operation is very simple since it is controlled by VCR-type record, pause, and stop recording buttons.

So, just press the big red record button. A pop-up window notifies you to press Ctrl-F10 to stop the recording. Press the "Start Recording" button in the pop-up dialogue box, perform the series of actions required to copy photographs from a camera to a folder on the computer's hard drive, and then press Ctrl-F10. The video is automatically saved and can be viewed by pressing the "Recordings" icon.

It is probably useful to set a few options prior to making a video tutorial. For example, you probably want the mouse movements to be visible in the recording so make sure that the "Show cursor while recoding" button is checked (or navigate to Mouse Options – Record). Similarly, you may wish to provide a verbal commentary on the on-screen actions so make sure that an appropriate microphone is selected through the Audio Options – Audio menu item.

The software has many more optional settings, but these are left for you to discover!

Our old site has hundreds of pages, mostly Product Reviews and many years (pages) of newsletters, and these will not be reformatted to the new look. Product reviews will now be in PDF format versus each review occupying an entire web page. This will greatly reduce the number of pages on our new site, so instead of numerous web pages, there will now be numerous (and more manageable) files. There were some early issues linking to our old site. Most of these have been resolved. We are still working on removing outdated content from the old site and merging pages with duplicate content. This will take some time, but for the most part, the new and old sites are working well in tandem.

Have a look at the new site. We will be looking for feedback in the coming months!

#### **Rainy Day Photos**

ow that spring has arrived, we will no doubt experience plenty of rainy days. Many of us pray for fair weather when travelling or hosting outdoor events with friends and family. Certainly, it puts everyone in a better mood but shooting into the sun has people backlit and having the sun behind has people squinting. Finding a shady spot, in an attractive setting, with even light is not always easy. Overcast skies or light rain can be a photographer's dream. This is primarily because the light is so even but as well, it gives you infinite options for positioning people or choosing multiple viewpoints for a landscape.

For general nature photography, I love a rainy day. It brings out the colours of vegetation and birds don't look like silhouettes when I get them back onto my computer. You don't have to worry about shadows or high contrast and you can shoot from any angle. For the effect of silky water (see below), you need a long exposure time, something that is easier to accomplish on a cloudy or rainy day. In Iceland, we encountered many sunny days with lots of reflected light from the massive waterfalls. It was pleasant for walking but I had little success achieving long exposures, even with the smallest aperture of my DSLR and a 4-stop neutral density filter! I would have preferred a sunless day.

Rain also gives you larger drops on plants or spider webs than dew does and it lasts longer before evaporating. With a fast shutter speed, you can even capture the raindrops as they fall. Keep your eye open for opportunities that arise after rainfall like reflections of famous buildings or statues in nearby puddles. Get a shot none of your fair-weather friends has!

A very light rain should not damage your camera, although it is smart to carry a microfiber cloth in your camera bag plus a lens cloth (or two) to wipe your lens. I also use those free hotel shower caps to cover my lens. If it starts to rain heavily, I tuck my camera into my bag or under my coat after every shot.

So bring on the April showers...I'll be ready!


