





I also have an "Other contacts" folder I never noticed. It has an "i" circle at the top that, if you hover over, says;



People you've interacted with in Google products, as well as any contacts you've hidden from your list. These contacts appear as autocomplete suggestions to help you communicate and share. Go to your Google Account to control how these contacts are saved.

Immersive Reader in Edge

Old Edge browser (based on Microsoft's rendering engine) had *Reading view* that removed ads, menus, etc. from web pages – when on a page that supports it

I thought it was gone in the new Edge (based on the Chromium engine)

Every web page I went to failed to display the icon for *Reading view*

Immersive Reader in Edge

It turns out it is still there. It has been renamed to *Immersive Reader*.

Problem: It only appears when on a page that supports *reader mode* and fewer and fewer pages support that.

Immersive Reader in Edge

Google Chrome supports *Reader mode* but is off by default. Browse to:

chrome://flags/#enable-reader-mode

and change its setting to Enabled

Firefox, Opera, and Vivaldi all have *reader modes* enabled by default



I am trying to get my Dell laptop to recognize a Philips monitor. I get a "No video input" message on the monitor. The monitor is not detected in Dell settings. I am using a converter cable since the laptop has HDMI, but the monitor has DisplayPort and DVI. How can I troubleshoot the problem?





Problem-solving approaches:

- Can the problem be reproduced on another computer (plug in the same cable/monitor)?
- There are multiple pieces involved (laptop video port, cable, dongle, monitor is it possible to validate each item separately?
- Can the problem be circumvented (such as using a different port on the monitor)?
- Are there multiple ways to send output to the monitor (e.g. a function key)?
- Is there any way to validate that a signal is actually going out the port?



Try the following:

- 1. Check that the monitor is working by connecting it to a second computer using any available port
- 2. Check that the laptop's output port is working by connecting it to a TV using an HDMI cable (select the correct TV source)
- 3. Plug the monitor into a second computer using the same cable/converter dongle
- 4. Try using another input on the monitor (if there is one)



- 5. Try another cable/converter. Swapping those out might tell you if the cable or converter is at fault.
- 6. Does the monitor have a configuration screen where you have to choose the input?
- 7. Some laptops require that you press a function key (e.g. F8) to select the output
- 8. What does pressing Win+P do? It normally gives the options to duplicate or extend the display, switch to just the primary screen or to the second screen.

Results:

The monitor worked when plugged in to a tablet

The laptop connected to a TV correctly

=> The problem is almost certainly the converter/cable.



Success!

The problem turned out to be the converter/cable. A new cable solved it. A \$7.00 fix!





"All Core i5 desktop processors offer 4 cores and no hyperthreading while in the mobile sector all Core i5 processors have 2 cores and hyperthreading."

What, in plain language, does this really mean to me as a run-of-the-mill laptop buyer?



Multi-tasking, multi-processing and multi-threading...

A single core CPU with no hyperthreading can only do one thing at once. But, we know the computer can multi-task and run a word processor, an E-mail client, and a web browser all "at the same time".

The OS achieves this by time-slicing the CPU cycles, giving some time to each process in turn. It happens so quickly that, to us, it appears that the tasks are concurrent.



A computer with multiple cores on its CPU can actually run different tasks concurrently, each task running on its own physical core.

Suppose that we are running a word processor in one window and, at the same time, in a second window, we are exporting to disk a video file that we have edited.

If our computer is dual-core, the word-processing task runs on Core 1 at the same time that the video is being written to disk using Core 2.



If our computer is single core but dualthreaded, the CPU appears to the operating system as having two (virtual) cores.

Suppose we have a word-processing task where a file has been sent to the printer and a second file has been opened for editing.

The print job is run on one thread of the single core of the CPU, while the editing is running on the second thread. The single core can only do one task at once, so what happens?



Since it takes "forever" (in CPU time) for our finger to move from one key to the next, while the word processing task is waiting for a character to process, control is switched to the thread for the print job and data is sent to the printer.

Once the editing thread is ready to accept a new keystroke, control is switched to this thread.

So, both tasks appear to be running concurrently while in actual fact the CPU is switching between them.



So, the multi-core CPU processes both tasks concurrently.

The single-core, multi-threaded CPU appears to be running two word-processing tasks at the same time.

In reality, it is just using the available CPU cycles efficiently by rapidly switching tasks when one of the tasks is "stalled".





An analogy for multi-threading is an airport security line where there are two queues of people undergoing initial screening of carry-on bags, but only one full-body scanner that both queues have to use. If one of the prescreening lines is held up, the people in the second queue flow through the scanner.

A "multi-core" security system would have a full-body scanner attached to each prescreening queue so that each queue would be processed completely independently.

So, a quad-core computer with hyperthreading would be about equivalent to having 5 cores

But a quad-core computer with no hyperthreading will generally perform better than dual-core with hyperthreading

Zip check failed for configuration file: C:\User\Orion\AppData\Local/The WeatherNetwork\WeatherEye.daz. File deleted.





I tried restoring the previous version but was informed of an:

Access violation at address 02961FB2 in module WeatherEye.dll Write of address 73726573

When I tried to delete or repair the file, I could not open the file.



Several websites stated that they had a free download of the Weather Network for Windows 10 but none functioned.

I even had a *Runtime error 216 at 0296228D* which I am informed represents a virus even though Kaspersky checks the file as being virus free.

Suggestions?



Try going to Settings | Apps


Windows Settings

Find a setting

Find The Weather Network and select it.

Uninstall, defaults, optional features

Choose Advanced options, then "Reset"

If this app isn't working right, we can try to repair it. The app's data won't be affected.

Repair



I have a new PC, Asus TUF A15 gaming PC with problems:

- 1. Mouse sometimes becomes jerky. Reboot solves. Mouse is Wacom Graphire2 pad with mouse and pen. Using Wacom drivers made it worse.
- 2. Added USB-C dock with DVI-D, VGA and HDMI outputs but none work. USB3 socket works.
- 3. Direct HDMI output does not work.



This is a gaming laptop. Has it been set to run at a higher than normal clock speed? If so, have you tried with normal clock speed?





As I recall, ASUS has a "Live update" program installed. Be sure to check it to see if there are any driver updates available. Could also visit their web site for driver updates:

Does Device Manager show any problems?



For the mouse and the USB dock - try different ports (if available) to make sure it is not a specific port having problems.

Mouse

I would keep checking to see if Wacom comes out with driver updates. I had a problem with their drivers once. They eventually did address the problem. Might be worth opening a support call with them. They were always very responsive to me when I opened calls.

Could this be an incompatibility issue?
Can it be checked on another PC to make sure it functions somewhere?
