Here are maps in [Garmin image file format](#) people have created from OSM data. Sites are listed by continent, then by country alphabetically, then by suspected usefulness (eg. sites which cover a whole continent and are updated regularly are listed first.) Maps offered worldwide or for a continent are often offering country downloads - hence they are only listed once and not for each region again. As OpenStreetMap is changing fast - only maps updated during the last 6 month should be listed. Permanently Dead links - please remove the entry.

Maps are offered in different formats. As .exe for Mapsource and Basecamp and Qlandkarte GT installation (.exe can usually be unpaved with 7-zip or other programs). As .gmapi for Mac OSX Roadtrip/Basecamp. As gmapsupp.img for direct copying to a Garmin GPS device.

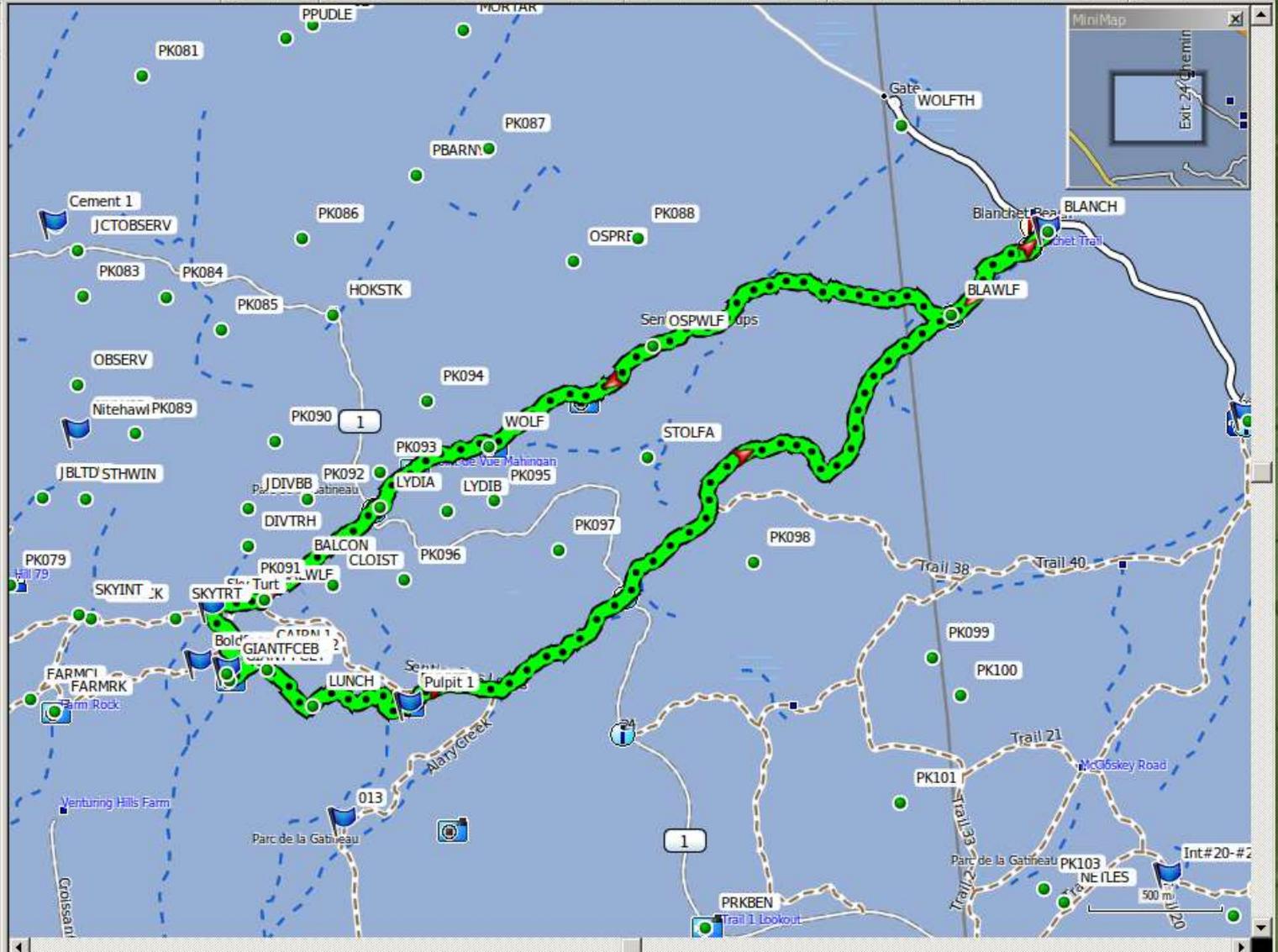

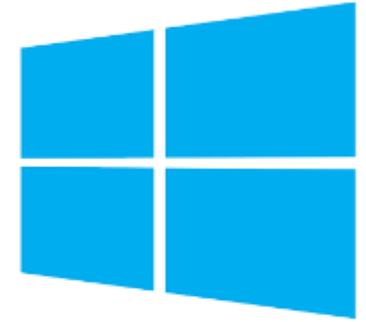

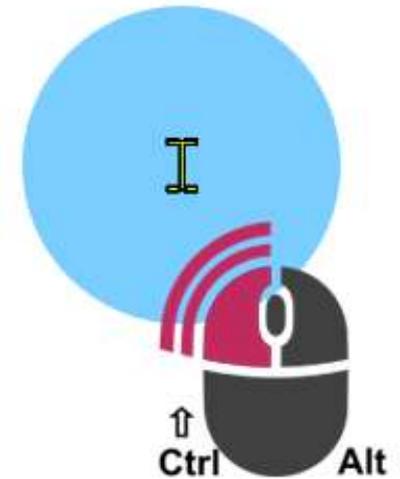

# Key'n'Strokes

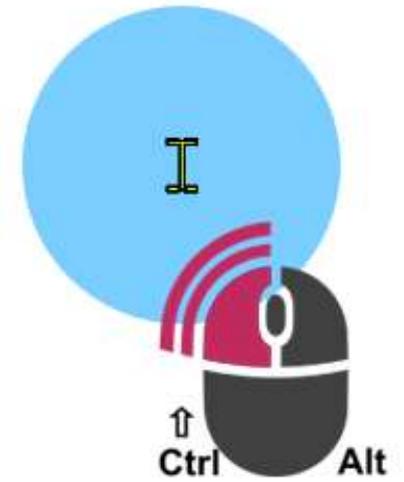


- Mouse pointer highlighter
- Great presenter's tool
- Audience can easily see
  - location of the mouse pointer
  - if modifier keys (Ctrl, Alt, Shift, Windows key) held down
  - if left/right mouse button clicked or double-clicked
  - if scroll wheel is pressed or rolled – & in what direction
  - keystrokes you press
- Highly customizable
- Free and open-source

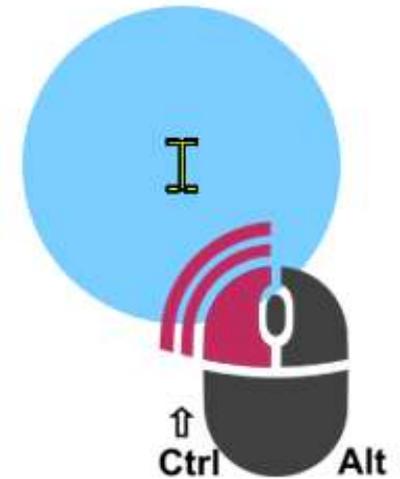

# Key'n'Strokes



- Wish list
  - hotkeys for toggling
    - *Indicate cursor position*
    - *Show icon on click*
    - *Show keystroke history*

    - even though it is fairly easily added manually

**This week we'll give some general information on VPN's.**

# **More On VPN's**

## **(Virtual Private Networks)**

- **VPN software creates a private encrypted connection (tunnel) between your computer, tablet or smartphone and a remote VPN server. The server puts you on the internet in whatever geographic location the server is located in. The VPN software will usually let you choose a server location, and the locations can be anywhere in the world.**
- **A VPN can be used to access internet services not available in your location (a practice called '*Geo Hopping*'). Note that some sites that require you to be in a specific geographical location (e.g. United States) can detect if you are using a VPN and block you anyway.**
- **A VPN can slow down your internet connection, so you may have to turn the VPN off when using some services (e.g. Zoom).**

# More On VPN's

## (Virtual Private Networks)

Some VPN's offer:

- **Multihop**, where your connection goes from one server to another to another to make your connection more difficult to trace
- **Split-tunneling**, which allows separate VPN connections (tunnels) to different end destinations
- **TOR connections**. TOR (The Onion Router) is free and open-source software for enabling anonymous communication. It directs Internet traffic through a free, worldwide, volunteer overlay network, consisting of more than six thousand relays, for concealing a user's location and usage from anyone conducting network surveillance or traffic analysis. Using Tor makes it more difficult to trace the Internet activity to the user. Tor's intended use is to protect the personal privacy of its users, as well as their freedom and ability to conduct confidential communication by keeping their Internet activities unmonitored.

# More On VPN's

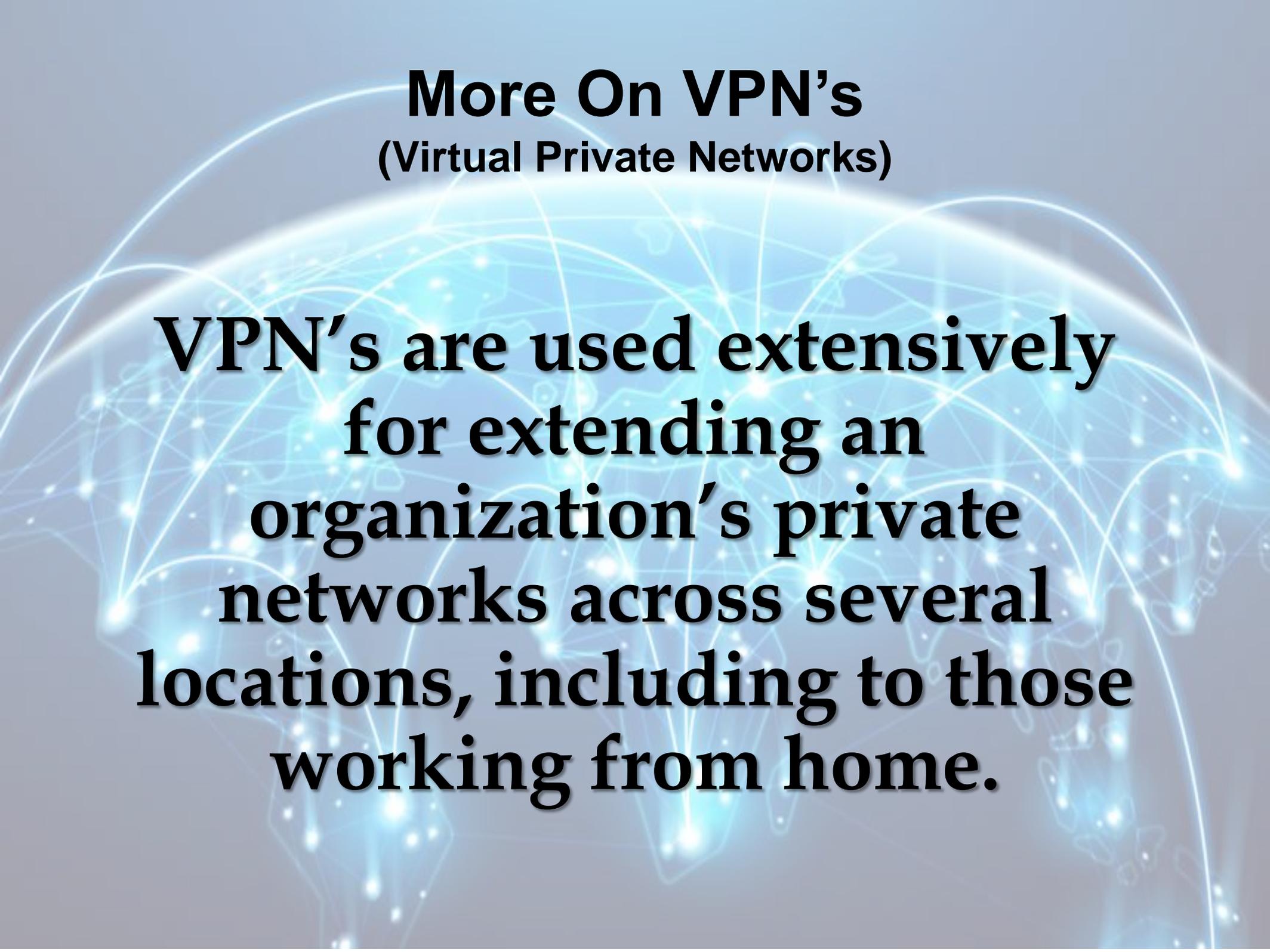
## (Virtual Private Networks)

- On public Wi-Fi (e.g. Tim Hortons, Starbucks, the hospital, your car dealer service waiting room, etc.), others on the Wi-Fi network can view your communications.
- A VPN's main role in *SECURITY* is when you are using public Wi-Fi because the VPN encrypts your communications (emails, banking, shopping, etc.) between your device (computer, tablet, smartphone, etc.) and the VPN server.
- Using a VPN on a reasonably secured home network doesn't really do a lot for security unless you're in a high density location like an apartment building. It's mainly an extra layer for *PRIVACY*. Even then, it's only one of many steps towards protecting your privacy. Like security, privacy must be done in layers.

# **More On VPN's**

## **(Virtual Private Networks)**

- **Some websites don't work properly with a VPN.**
- **At various times I've had problems with Costco, Loblaws, Home Depot and a few others (although Costco is OK now) and had to turn the VPN off to use them.**
- **I've come across a couple of sites that detected I was using a VPN and told me to turn it off if I wanted to connect. The same applies with ad blocking and anti-tracking software.**
- **Sites that ask to know your location will get the wrong info if you use a VPN, especially if you're geo hopping.**



# **More On VPN's**

**(Virtual Private Networks)**

**VPN's are used extensively for extending an organization's private networks across several locations, including to those working from home.**

# More On VPN's

## (Virtual Private Networks)

- There are several good paid for VPN's such as NordVPN and ExpressVPN.
- The Avast SecureLine VPN comes free with the very good Avast Premium and Avast One (formerly Avast Ultimate) security packages, but if you have to pay for it separately then NordVPN and ExpressVPN are probably better choices. \*
- There are also some good free VPN's like Proton.
- Beware the VPN company's privacy policy. Some companies sell your browsing information.
- Before acquiring ANY software you should look at SEVERAL reviews to make sure it is the right choice for you and to weed out bogus reviews designed to *'make a silk purse out of a sows ear'*.
- A good review on VPN's is PC Magazines "[The Best VPN Services for 2022](#)".

# **More On VPN's**

## **(Virtual Private Networks)**

**If your internet activity is pretty vanilla then privacy (as opposed to security) might not be a big concern for you. But if you:**

- Use Facebook or other social media a lot**
- Are involved in any political, human rights or protest activities,**
- Download pirated music, movies, etc.**
- Go to adult websites**
- Etc., etc., etc.**

**Then you should use a VPN, AND take additional privacy measures.**

# More On VPN's

## (Virtual Private Networks)

- A VPN provides *some* tracking protection because you get a different IP address, sometimes every time you connect to the VPN. For sites that track by IP address, that will throw them off the scent.
- A VPN on its own doesn't do anywhere nearly as much to protect your privacy as the commercials would have you believe. There are several ways to get around a VPN to track you including:
  - Cookies,
  - Fingerprinting,
  - Supercookies and Evercookies,
  - Beacons (AKA 'tags' or 'tracking pixels'),
  - Malware.

# **More On VPN's**

## **(Virtual Private Networks)**

**For maximum privacy protection you need to also consider:**

- A VPN that has multihop, split-tunneling, and TOR connections**
- What browser(s) you use.**
- What your browser privacy settings are.**
- Which search engine(s) you use.**
- Using anti-tracking and add blocker software.**
- How you use social media like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Tick-Tock, Pinterest, YouTube, etc. These sites get a substantial part of their revenue by tracking you and selling your personal information to advertisers and others.**
- etc., etc., etc.**

**We'll cover some of this during upcoming Q&A sessions.**

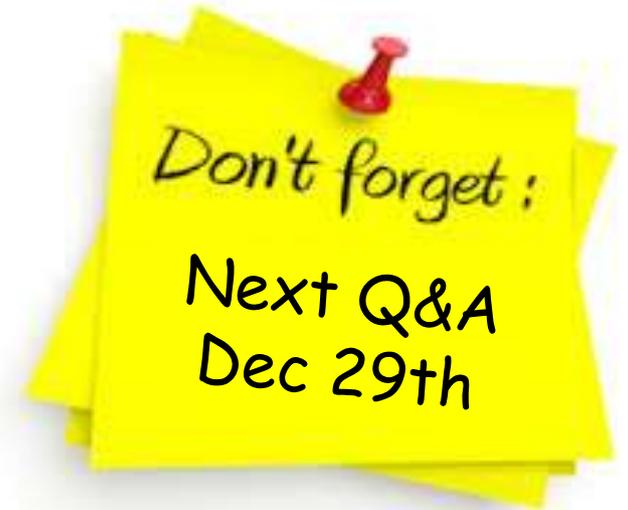

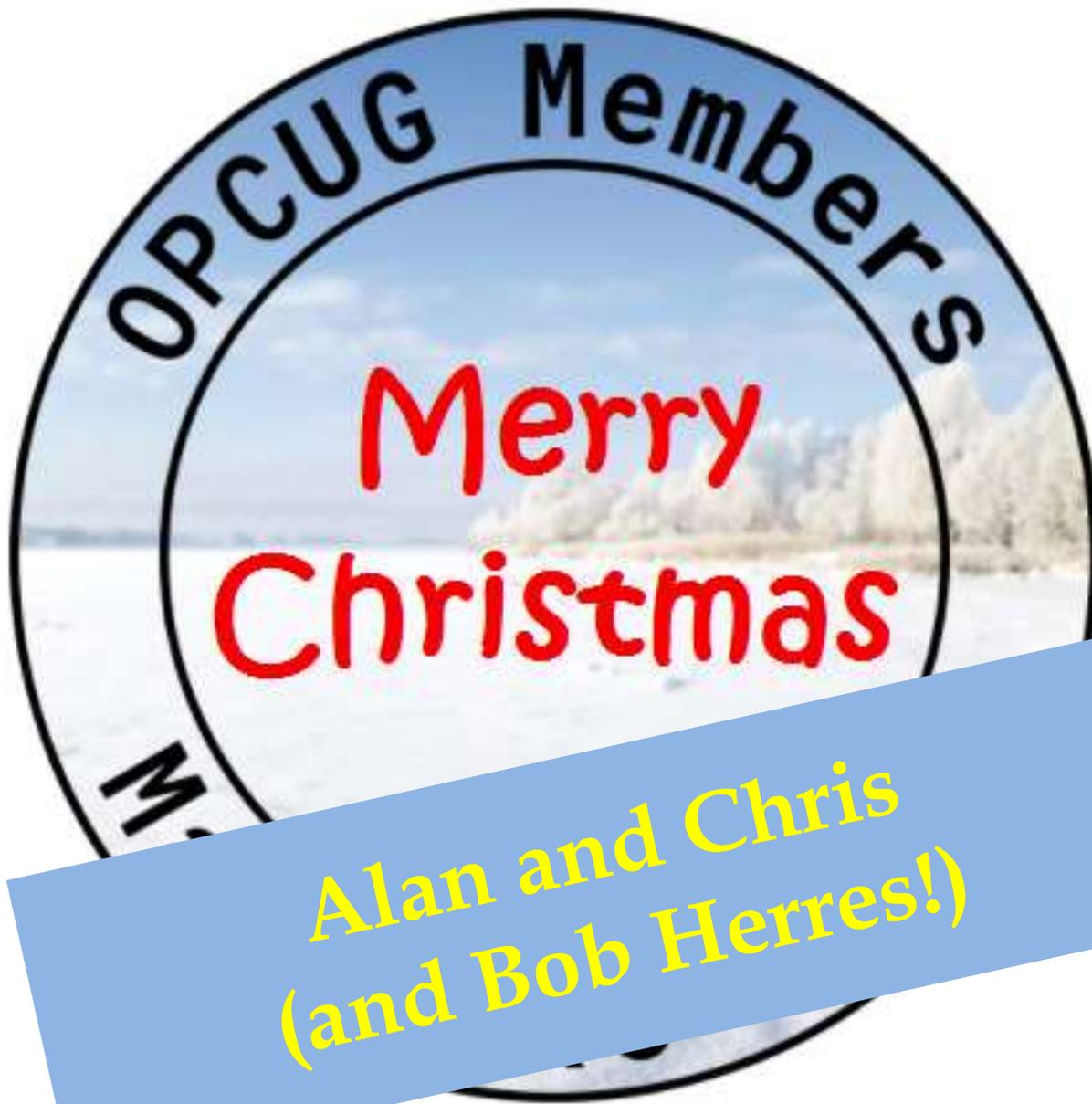
