

## **1. Dodgy websites are a no-go for me**

- If I get a banner or ad pop up that I just can't close, I'll often just shut the whole PC down
- If possible, you can simply close the tab in your browser .

## **2. I always use reputable antivirus and antimalware software**

## **4. I keep everything updated**


## **5. I read emails with a skeptical mind**

- Never click on any links or download any attachments and look out for obvious warning signs like spelling mistakes
- Do not click on links in emails that supposedly come from crucial accounts like banks.

## **6. I avoid public networks and use a VPN**


## **7. I use strong passwords and multi-factor authentication**






# Wemo Smart Switches

- Owned 4 Belkin *Wemo Mini* smart switches
- Allowed me to turn bedroom/living room lights on/off
  - by voice using *Google Assistant* with
    - *Google Home Mini* in living room
    - *Lenovo Smart Clock* in bedroom
  - with routines in *Google Assistant* and *Wemo* app
    - automate lights on/off at specific times
  - through *Wemo* app on phone from anywhere in the world
- Some frustrations over the years
  - periodically, when trying to control switches by voice
    - *Cannot contact Wemo right now*





# Belkin drops the ball


- July, 2025: Belkin announced it is dropping support
- Not only would I lose automation features, but
  - *Wemo smart products will turn into paperweights in 2026*
- I could *maybe* see losing capabilities that used Belkin servers
- I couldn't see why I would lose automation functions controlled by app on phone talking directly to switches
- I think should be able to maintain static routines & control through the Wemo app on phone

# Choosing a replacement

- Decided to no longer buy *Belkin* products
  - not happy with perfectly good switches turned into doorstops
  - no logical reason why support should be dropped – *except greed*
- Looked for replacement for the *Wemo* smart switches
- Read reviews on various makes and models
- Settled on *Kasa* from *TP-Link*
  - good reviews
  - good capabilities
  - good pricing
  - can be controlled through
    - *Google Assistant*
    - *Amazon Alexa*

## Easy setup

- Download *Kasa* app on phone
- Create account at *Kasa* website
- Use *Kasa* app
  - connect directly to smart plug over WiFi
  - configure smart plug to connect to your network
- Use *Google Assistant* app to connect to *Kasa* device
- Only one minor issue (easily worked around)
  - *Kasa* smart plugs only operate on 2.4 GHz Wi-Fi
  - *for initial setup*, phone must be connected on 2.4 GHz Wi-Fi to router
  - forced phone to connect on 2.4 GHz by moving further from Wi-Fi access point than is supported by 5 GHz
    - could also have temporarily disabled 5 GHz band at router
    - could also have configured separate names for 2.4 and 5 GHz bands
  - *after initial setup, phone can be on any network*

# Final configuration

- Main usage *for me*: voice control through Google Assistant
  - *Living room light off*
  - *Goodnight* (tells me date/time, weather & calendar items for tomorrow, **turns off living room and bedroom lights...**)
  - *Good morning* (**turns on bedroom light**, tells me date/time, weather & calendar items for the day, streams radio station)
  - *Leaving* (**turns off lights**, stops radio streaming, tells me traffic)
  - etc.
- Created a few directly scheduled items through Kasa app
  - living room and bedroom lights on and off at specific times
  - advantage of Kasa app: it can randomize times
    - if away from home, lights not on/off at exactly same time every day



  - 4-pack \$45




Amount of food that's thrown away that could have been eaten.

  - can easily recover if things go south
- Started upgrade from the *Windows Update* page

After a couple of hours...

- it failed
- rolled back (successfully)  
to Windows 10


# Why did it fail?

- Checked online for common fixes to upgrade failures
  - updated NVIDIA drivers
  - checked Device Manager (Win+X > *Device Manager*)
    - no warnings
  - ran *Windows Update Troubleshooter*
    - no problems found
  - ran *Deployment Image Servicing and Management*
    - **dism /online /cleanup-image /restorehealth**
  - ran System File Checker
    - **sfc /scannow**
  - some discrepancies about availability of BIOS update

## ...and then I got specific

- Asked Perplexity.AI – *Does ACER support upgrading from Windows 10 to Windows 11 on Predator PO-03-600*
  - **Acer does not support upgrading to Windows 11**
  - Official Acer Guidance
    - Predator PO3-600 not listed in Acer's Windows 11 upgrade compatibility tables
    - **recommended to stick with Windows 10**
  - Windows 11 Upgrade Feasibility
    - Microsoft may allow the upgrade: base hardware meets requirements
    - **operational issues due to missing or outdated drivers may arise**
    - **blue screen errors & device instability following attempted upgrades**
  - Recommendations
    - **continuing with Windows 10 advised for Predator PO3-600 owners**
    - upgrading to Windows 11 unsupported by Acer and carries risks of driver incompatibilities and hardware issues
- PC will get one more year through Extended Security Updates
  - and likely get replaced in the next year

- You need an installation disk
- Obtain Microsoft's *Media Creation Tool*  
**now, before you actually need it!**
- MediaCreationTool\_22H2.exe
- Use an 8GB+ USB drive

# Create installation media for Windows

**► Applies To**

Installation media, such as a USB flash drive, can be used to install a new copy of Windows, perform a clean installation of Windows, or reinstall Windows.

To create installation media, go to the [software download website](#), where step-by-step instructions can be found. On that website, you can select a version of Windows and create installation media on a USB flash. Alternatively, an ISO file can be created for use in virtual machines (VMs) or for burning the installation media onto a DVD:

**Windows 11****Windows 10****Support for Windows 10 will end in October 2025**

After October 14, 2025, Microsoft will no longer provide free software updates from Windows Update, technical assistance, or security fixes for Windows 10. Your PC will still work, but we recommend moving to Windows 11.

1. When Windows 10 is ready to install, you'll see a recap of what you've chosen, and what will be kept through the upgrade.   2. Save and close any open apps and files you may be running, and when you're ready, select **Install**.
  3. It might take some time to install Windows 10, and your PC will restart a few times. **Make sure you don't turn off your PC.**

# Installation Process

- Getting a few things ready...
- **Accept licence terms => Accept**
- **What do you want to do? => Upgrade => Next**
  - *or create installation media  
(for a different computer)*
- Downloading Windows 10, verifying your download, creating Windows 10 media
- Setup is cleaning up before it closes
- Installation program restarts...



- Preparing, getting updates (again), checking your PC, we're getting a few things ready
- **Accept licence terms (again) => Accept**
- Choose what to keep [no choice!], getting updates (again!), making sure you are ready to install, making sure your PC has enough space
- **Ready to install, Change what to keep => Nothing**  
*(Keep personal files and apps [default],  
Keep personal files only, or Nothing)*
- Getting updates, making sure you are ready to install, making sure your PC has enough space (again! – because I chose nothing?)
- **Ready to install => Install**





- Installing Windows 10
- Your PC will restart several times
- This may take a while...
- **Setup questions:**
  - Region => Canada
  - Keyboard => US
  - *(Disable voice control)*
  - Second keyboard layout => Skip
  - Connect to network => I don't have Internet  
=> Continue with limited setup

**If you connect to Wi-Fi, later you will have to use a Microsoft account or create a new one; don't connect if you want to use a local account**

- Who's going to use the PC? => Admin
- Create a super memorable password => Admin
- Confirm your password => Admin

- Create security questions => Three questions with nonsense answers
- Let Microsoft apps use your location => No
- Find my device => No

# Consumer Reports has words for Microsoft

## Consumer Reports calls on Microsoft to extend support for Windows 10

September 16, 2025

Consumer Reports sent a letter to Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella calling on the company to extend its support of Windows 10 devices given the security threat posed by leaving millions of operational devices unprotected. On October 14, these computers will be stranded when Microsoft transitions from the Windows 10 operating system to Windows 11. Windows 10 is currently used by an estimated 46% of Windows computers, and a significant percentage of these machines are unable to run Windows 11.

Consumer Reports is calling on Microsoft to provide free extended support for consumers who have not — and often cannot — make the transition, and to continue providing that support for free until more users have transitioned off the older OS. In the attached letter we explain why Microsoft's decision to provide paid support only for one year is a security risk, and how the lack of backwards compatibility for certain Windows 10 machines sold only a couple of years ago is a blow to consumers' pocketbooks. Microsoft should do the right thing and continue supporting Windows 10 without charging consumers.

### Highlights from letter

- computers incapable of running Windows 11 still available for sale in 2022 and 2023
- as of August, 46.2% of people worldwide still using Windows 10
  - about 646.8 million people based on Microsoft's estimates of 1.4 billion people using Windows
  - estimated 200-400 million PCs worldwide cannot be upgraded to Windows 11
- Decision to make Windows 11 incompatible with existing hardware, & with only 4 years notice is incompatible with consumer expectations and Microsoft's own history
- Arguing that Windows 11 is an essential upgrade to boost cybersecurity while also leaving hundreds of millions of machines more vulnerable to cyber attacks is hypocritical
